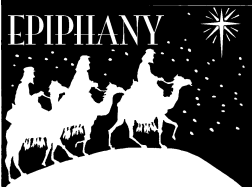

EPIPHANY

Join us on Tuesday, January 6th at 7:30pm for an Epiphany service to celebrate the revelation of Christ. Epiphany means "manifestation." On this day we celebrate the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles—that is, to all nations. Christians traditions celebrate three great epiphanies on this day: the magi's adoration of the Christ child, Jesus; baptism in the Jordan River, and his first miracle, in which he changes water into wine. The word and sacraments are for us the great epiphany of God's grace and mercy. We go forth to witness to the light that shines brightly in our midst.

Congregational Meeting Sunday, January 11th at 9:15 am

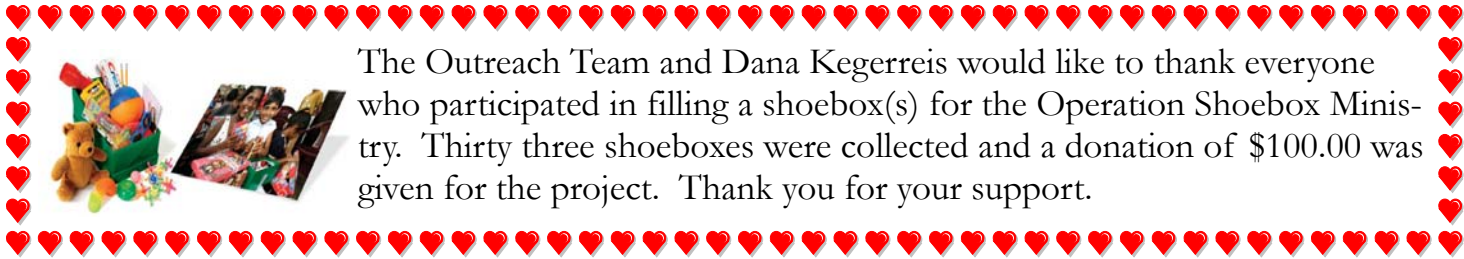

The Support Team has received 2 card tables in memory of Roberta Bencker from an anonymous donor. Living God Church and the Support Team is very thankful for this wonderful gift.

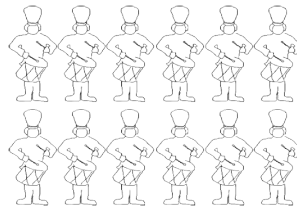


Time To Renew Your Subscription



Somewhere around early January parents of small children hear the lament, “Why can’t it be Christmas every day?” The thought may even splash across our minds with a brief sense of child-like wonder before being snuffed out by a quick reminder of reality. Truly there are some things about Christmas that our lives simply could not handle if we were to try to maintain them everyday, all year. The first, of course is our wallets. Can you imagine having to shop for folks in such a way that everyday was Christmas? Oh, and by the way, you would likely have no income because if everyday was Christmas your place of employment would likely never be open. If everyday was Christmas much of our way of life would soon be in jeopardy. The truth is; if it were Christmas everyday we couldn’t handle it. We must go back to work. Kids must go back to school. to make music in the heart.*

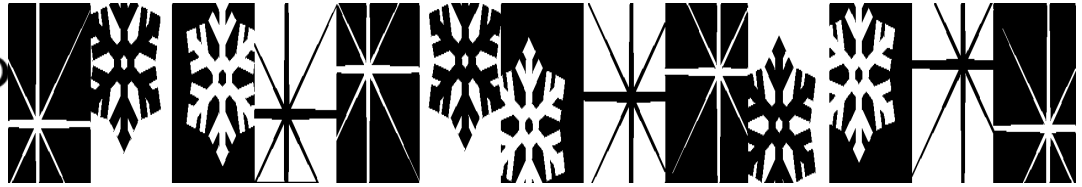

RECYCLE YOUR CELL PHONE

S.E.P.A. is working with the Women's Funding Network to collect 500 cell phones by June 20, 2009 for recycling. With one simple act, you can create two lasting solutions for women and families in poverty and help combat climate change!



The Benefits-This recycling program will generate much needed funding to;

1. Support programs that lift women and families out of pov-erty;
2. Help provide lasting solutions to climate change, a major contributor to poverty worldwide; and
3. Provide 911 emergency phones for senior citizens and peo-ple at risk.

Why is This Important? In the U.S., more that HALF A BIL-LION cell phones are no longer being used and are ready for recycling.

1. Each cell phone recycled helps prevent 66 pounds of car-bon dioxide from entering the atmosphere.
2. Recycling just one million cell phones reduces green-house gas emissions equal to taking 1,368 cars off the road for a year.
3. If all 500 million cell phones no longer in use are recycled, we could save enough energy to power more that 970,000 U.S. households with electricity for one year.

2. Turn the phone off, leaving the battery attached.
3. Place the phone in the box in front of the church office.
