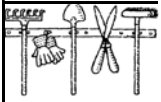
## Wed. Night Soup & Evening Devotion March 4th — April 1st

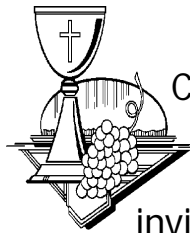

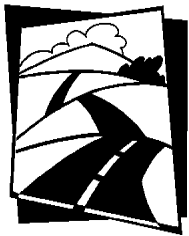

Dear friends,

The whole is greater than the sum of the parts.

Imagine a building filled with rooms. In each room is a single person playing beautifully a musical instrument. In one room there is a violinist, in another a drummer playing the timpani, in yet another is a woman with a trumpet. At the end of the hall there is a room with a conductor, wildly moving her hands and arms in silence as she, like the others, is alone in her individual room. A stroll down this hall reveals all the parts of a grand symphony, but not a symphony because all the parts are playing individually to themselves. A symphony would be wonderful, and many would surely be inspired by the beautiful music they made together. But, they are not together, they are alone with their individual talents. The symphony is greater than the sum of the instruments.

Now imagine a church building filled with people. Each person has certain talents and gifts. In one person is the ability to teach. In another is the ability to promote things. In still another is the gift of finance. Someone else has a specific talent with arts and crafts. Someone else has a gift with music. And, finally, another person has the gift of organization. A brief stroll through this church building would be an encounter with these very fine and wonderful people, each with their individual gifts. Yet, if these people were to work together and be willing to offer their special talent or gift for the benefit of the whole they would find that they have all the parts to create possibly a vacation bible school program, or maybe a drama ministry, or some other dream that God only knows. But, in this imaginary church, these people remain alone with their special talents, and the dream of ministry together is lost. The church is greater than the sum of its gifts.

St. Paul puts it this way in his first letter to the Corinthians, "*The body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts; and though all its parts are many, they form one body. So it is with Christ.*" Together the parts make up the body of Christ for the world. The body of Christ is the church, and the body of Christ is capable of ministering to a hurting and hopeless world of people. But, the parts by themselves acting alone remain alone and disconnected from the body of Christ. Without a doubt, every individual Christian responding faithfully on their own in the world can be a powerful witness of God's loving mercy. But, Christians that share together, worship together and form the body of Christ together has the power to transform and overcome things in such a way that can only be described with the word miraculous. The body of Christ is greater than the sum of the faithful.

Inserted in this newsletter is an invitation for you to offer your talents and gifts to the whole. It's slightly different from the forms you may be used to seeing. Rather than ask you to volunteer for a specific opening that needs volunteers, this form simply asks you to share what you are capable of doing. At church you will find a drop off box and additional Time & Talent Sheets for you to donate your particular gifts. Everyone's gifts will be organized according to where they might best be used to benefit our church's whole ministry. You will then be contacted and invited to help in various ways that are fitting for your gifts. It's also quite possible that you will be invited to offer your gifts in ways that begin with brainstorming and dreaming of potential ministries that are only now being discovered through this process. Every member is asked to fill out a Time & Talent Sheet. When we come together with our gifts we are capable of so much more than when we don't.

Living God Lutheran Church is greater than the sum of its members.

Are you a member of this church who hasn't shared your time or talent in a while? If so, then you're probably feeling a little disconnected? Isn't it time you got connected? With a little creativity even the shut-ins can offer their gifts and become more active. Offer your time and talent, and together we'll share the joy of a ministry that only the body of Christ can achieve.
