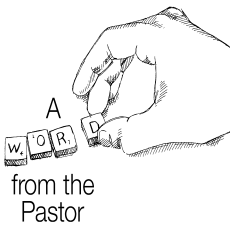
### First Communion

Dear friends,

“Pastor, what is an ‘active’ member?” That’s the question that was recently put to me.

The answer begins with the church constitution. When we speak of “active members” we are referring to those who have the ability to participate in the fullness of the life of the church, the decision-making process, leadership, etc. Constitutionally, these folks are the voting members of the church. So, to define what we mean by “active membership” we look to the constitution’s definition of “voting membership”. Voting members are those who, during the current or preceding calendar year, have communed in this congregation and have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Put another way, since we have communion each time we worship, active members are those who have come to worship and contributed financially at least once within the last year.

To many of you reading this, I’m sure this strikes you as a very low expectation of membership in the church; come to church just one time in a whole year, put a dollar in your envelope and you remain an “active” member. I understand how you feel on this one. I confess that I find it a bit bothersome myself. But, to others this is a statement of God’s amazing grace. It communicates exactly what we believe, that God’s church is in His hands, and up to his mercy. Thankfully, we are a people of God’s grace, so this articulation of what many of us think is too low an expectation remains necessary.

Nevertheless, it is also necessary to give the members of the church a clear understanding of their role as “active” members. The way I look at it, the difference between active and inactive members is to do with the mission. The gifts of the church (worship, fellowship, prayer, education, growth, connection, etc.) are all free for anyone who will receive them whether you are member or visitor. Meanwhile, it is the “active” members of the congregation who step across a threshold of sorts. They go from being merely recipients of these gifts to those who are committed to providing them for others.

I like to think of our church as that of an umbrella—one that can fit hundreds of people under it. I believe we live in a very rainy world. The rain, of course, is a symbol for the pain, suffering, struggle that we all face every day. Sometimes, it rains really hard! This is why I like to think of our church as a gigantic umbrella, under which we who gather close together in God’s grace find protection and warmth from the rain. The protection and warmth are God’s free gifts, and all are welcome to come and gather together to receive it. The umbrella itself is the gospel of Jesus Christ. Jesus withstands the beating of the rain so that we might gather under him and find shelter.

But, just like an umbrella, someone has to hold it up. The gospel is God’s free gift to us, but someone has to be willing to hold it up so that it’s shelter can be realized. If no one holds up the umbrella, then no one finds shelter from the rain. Active members are the ones under the umbrella who are willing to hold it up and allow everyone to gather underneath. A church without active members, is not a church at all. It’s just a group of people standing together in the rain.

Thankfully, Living God Lutheran is not a group of people standing in the rain. But, the list of people holding up the umbrella is terribly small when we consider the constitutionally defined size of our membership. For instance, as of our recent stewardship emphasis, out of more than 300 members only 57 have filled out a time, talent, or treasure card; committing themselves to holding up the umbrella. In other words, there is only 20% of our congregation who are actually and functionally “active” in this church’s ministry.

The rain falls just the same on all of us. Thankfully, God shelters us from the storm by the free gift of his Son, made known in the work of the church. Now, if you’re one who appreciates the shelter of the umbrella, but has not committed yourself to holding it up, then please consider doing so. There are 57 people who could really use your help.
